Julia's Second letter to the Faithful of All Souls 24 March 2020.

Dear All Souls Members and Friends,

Greetings in the name of the One whose love remains constant and steady amid uncertainty and change.

Many things have changed since my letter of 19/3/20 and they will continue to do so.

The Archbishop has confirmed that "churches are to be closed, including outdoor spaces associated with churches ... The exception is for weddings and funerals which can be held so long as they involve only very small groups of people and the current distancing and hygiene requirements are maintained. I had hoped that we might be able to have our churches open for private prayer, but this is now not the case."

New Parish Council elected

In this regard, the faithful resolve of God's people was on display last Sunday 22/3/20, with record attendance for worship at 9.00am and the Vestry meeting that followed.

We gave fitting recognition to Ann Peisley for her years of service (see photo with Warden Colin McLeay) and the new Parish Council was elected: We welcome new members Mano De Mel and Emma Robinson, and thank Sue Crees, Sara Blunt and Colin McLeay for standing again.

I want to thank Ali Brookman for serving on Parish Council and have asked her forgiveness for not recognising her publicly. I am grateful that she will continue to make her steady and thoughtful wisdom available to church leadership.

We also thanked Elizabeth Westphalen who celebrated 22 years to the day since her first duty as Lay assistant on 22 March,1998.

I will continue to ring the church bell at 12.00pm every day as an auditory witness that the church, the community of the people of God continues, no matter the circumstances. I will send regular updates, which will be printed and put into the post boxes of those who are not connected. With the help of Mano De Mel, our new Minutes Secretary and pew sheet coordinator, we will continue to send out or deliver the pew sheet with prayers and other resources in place of rosters and dates for meetings.

Worship

While we can no longer worship together as a parish family, we can use this time of "social distancing" to try new ways to exercise our "spiritual muscles". I will send suggestions each week that we can use at home, recognising that not everyone chooses to live a "digital lifestyle".

The first resource is the Lectio Divina we used in Sunday worship, which is attached, plus a sermon by the Archbishop from last Sunday, Lent IV. It speaks very powerfully into our new "Covid-19 reality" and the anxiety many people feel. I encourage you to read it.
