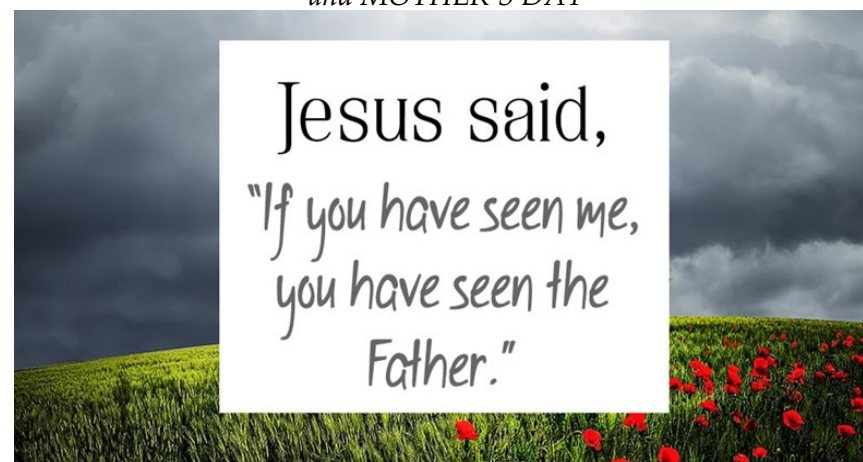

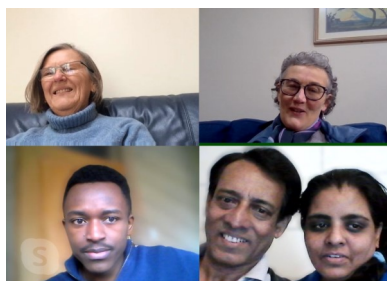
Rolling Garage Sale

Assistant to the Primate (AP) appointed

Archdeacon David Bassett of St Matthew’s Kensington has been appointed as assistant to Bishop Geoff in his role as Primate, funded by General Synod. He will continue as Archdeacon of the City of Adelaide and the Port. He will begin as AP part-time in May while continuing part-time as the Rector of Kensington until October, when he will be AP and Archdeacon full-time.

GOOD NEWS from the Treasurer

When churches were closed in late March, we were concerned that envelope and open plate giving would be significantly reduced as a result.

I am therefore delighted to tell you that giving in April was slightly higher than in March. Direct debit contributors continued giving, and while some who usually give via envelope converted to EFT, while others posted their contributions into our new letter box. Some “open plate” givers also moved to EFT. **THANK YOU** sincerely for your ongoing financial support, whatever your preferred method.

MORE GOOD NEWS

All Souls’ Parish has been approved for the Federal Government’s JobKeeper subsidy. We will receive \$1,500 per fortnight for up to six months to help with Julia’s stipend.

Although we had the unexpected expense of repairs to the arch inside the church, this work was partially financed by fund-raising efforts from recent years. When services resume, we will be able to enter through the main doors again!

BACK TO REALITY

We have lost the income earned by the hire of Coles Hall and did not receive the usual Easter services bonus of around \$1000 in open plate offerings. The cost of maintaining church services and properties does not decrease and until activities return to some degree of normality, we will rely heavily on your regular giving.

Our community spirit has not been diminished but has grown in a time of separation and uncertainty. Please continue to support Julia in prayer as she works hard to ensure that All Souls’ Parish remains relevant in the St Peters’ community. Thank you and keep up the good works. – Sue
