News from Parish Council (PC) 13/10/20

- The National Trust account balance at end August: \$32 185,32
- **Safer Ministry** requirements are now all on-line to streamline the process; in parishes with no significant children's ministry, only the parish priest is now required to have WWCC (working with children clearance), no longer all members active in ministry
- The parish **bank balance** is currently very healthy: Over \$50 000
- In the NCLSurvey members identified **spiritual growth** as a desired focus: How should we foster this in 2021?
- Quotation to replace the roof: \$320 000 make this our next fundraising priority
