Motions:

Parish Council requests that Vestry approve the following motions:

1. "We seek retrospective approval from the Diocese for the removal of pews from the Lady Chapel in 2000 and from the rear of the church in 1995 and the subsequent sale of some of those pews".

2. "Currently, the remaining pews that were removed are stored in various places and we request permission to sell some of these to raise funds for the on-going maintenance of the church building."

DISCUSSION ONLY

To unscrew and move alternate rows of pews from the church to be replaced by chairs spaced so that we are compliant with COVID-19 distancing regulations.

Individuals must be:

- A member of The Anglican Church of Australia,

- Have received Holy Communion not less than 3 times during the past 12 months (August '20 August '21),

Visit to All Souls' Anglican Church, St Peters, 7 July

Proceedings for the 20 or so guests began with a generous morning tea, followed by an excellent brief history of the church given by parishioner Sue Crees, who concentrated on the building's magnificent stained glass windows.



William Morris set up a workshop in England in 1861, producing tapestry, walipaper, furniture, jewellery - and stained glass. South Australia has 14 windows by the Morris Company, and five of them are in All Souls'. These depict St Paul, Jonathan, the Archangel Michael (all from designs by the Pre-Raphaelite artist Edward Burne-Jones), 'War', and 'Peace'. Other windows include three transferred from St Paul's, Pulteney St, Adelaide, after it was deconsecrated in 1983. Several windows commemorate the fallen of the World Wars.

The building, constructed in brick in 1915-16, was pushed for by the redoubtable Canon Wilfred Murphy, and replaced a simpler wooden church dating from 1883. Its style is 'Byzantine', and it contains curious pieces taken from mediaeval English churches.

The building and its contents constitute one of Adelaide's treasures.
