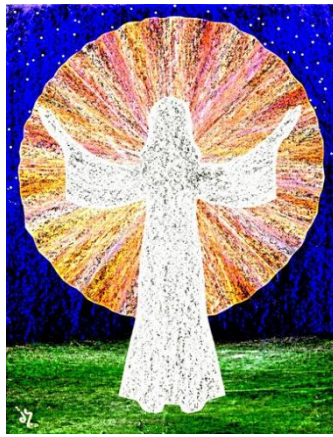

2026 Annual Vestry Meeting


A good attendance at the meeting on Sunday 8th February confirmed that the congregation continues to take an active interest in the management of All Souls' Parish. Following the 'boring bits' of a formal meeting, the many reports were tabled, discussed and accepted.

The current wardens Emma Robinson and Pauline Parfitt were re-elected, and the election of a new Parish Council came after it was moved and approved that the Parish could elect up to 6 members to the Council. Thus, the nominations of Ann Peisley, Denise Kirk, Brenton Brockhouse, Chris Brockhouse, Lorraine Gormly and Vernon Lewis were duly accepted. Archdeacon David Covington-Groth, who chaired the meeting in the absence of a priest-in-charge, then appointed Sarah Blunt as the priest's representative on Council.

The Vestry passed the motion to authorise Parish Council to spend up to \$20,000 from the All Souls' Endowment Trust for unspecified and necessary outlay in keeping with the terms of the Trust Deed "...for the upkeep of the Church, including the fabric of its building..."

The Vestry Meeting then discussed the motion for Vestry to authorise the All Souls' Endowment Trust to provide an interest-free loan of up to \$150,000 for the purpose of installing new toilets on the church property. After many views were expressed and expanded, the Vestry approved this loan to be repaid from the proceeds of the sale of Coles Hall which will occur later in 2026.

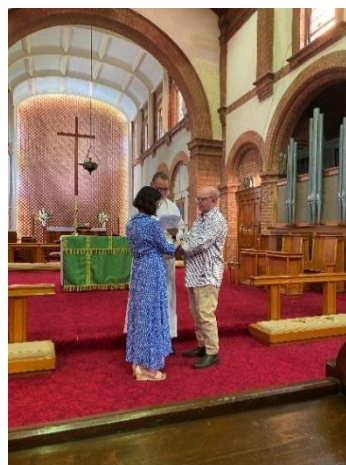
