WORDS



Recently, Akilan expressed his pleasure at the way the Readings and Psalms are shared during services. He explained that the Bible Readings, Psalms and Gospels should be **PROCLAIMED** as distinct from being **READ**.

The Cambridge Dictionary provides definitions for both words. Here is a comparison of the two:

To **Read** – *“to say the words that are printed or written”*

To **Proclaim** – *“to announce something publicly or officially, especially something positive”*



Another interesting and lovely word was discussed during a conversation after a recent church service. Geoffrey and Patsy shared a ‘new’ old word, that is appropriate for this season, and that they have been using whenever possible. Once again, the Cambridge Dictionary* comes to our aid:

APRICITY - the warmth of the sun, especially in winter or on a cold day. It is a rare word to describe the warmth of the winter sun on your face, last popular in the 1600s and until recently considered obsolete, but is enjoying a revival.

Let's find opportunities to use it while we can.

He spent some time speaking with Akilan and hearing some of All Souls' history, and expressed an interest in bringing members of his faith group to visit.

Keith and Jane live just a few miles from Kelmscott Manor, the residence of William Morris. They are both familiar with his history and offered interesting details about the life and home of William Morris. Fiona was baptised and came to Sunday School at All Souls' church so was interested to revisit her childhood memories.

Requests from unexpected places to view inside All Souls' church show that our history and heritage are of interest to many people outside of the immediate community.

On Sunday 30th August 2020, the Parish celebrated a combined service of thanksgiving for the ability to celebrate Holy Communion in the Church.

- ❖ At the end of March 2020, churches were closed for services, although we offered a "drive-through church" outside in the carpark where prayers and blessings were delivered at a distance.
- ❖ We couldn't celebrate the festival of Easter together in the church.
- ❖ Skype coffee-and-chat sessions kept people in touch
- ❖ The church bells rang every day at 12 noon to remind all who could hear that they were not alone
- ❖ Some services resumed in June and all services were once again celebrated from the beginning of July, although we continued to observe/recommend the Covid protocols of "Sign in, distance and wear a mask" for the next 2 years.

A NEW SHORT COURSE FROM ST BARNABAS COLLEGE
